



THE IMPACT OF INTERNATIONAL HEALTH CRISIS ON LEGAL INFRASTRUCTURE FOR TRADE

Background

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Armenia and the Secretariat of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL) are pleased to organise an event on the "Impact of the international health crisis on legal infrastructure for trade", in Yerevan, Armenia in a hybrid format.

This event is generously hosted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Armenia and will bring together experts from government agencies, the judiciary, academia, legal practice and the private sector to discuss disruptions to international trade, contractual arrangements and enterprises following Covid-19 and exchange legislative practices on responses and resilience by States to support international trade and enterprises. Further, it will be a unique opportunity to advance the UNCITRAL exploratory work on the impact of COVID-19 on international trade law by presenting the main components of an emergency tool kit for economies and public and private stakeholders in the event of a future health crisis that could similarly impact supply chains and trade flows. The results of the event will be presented orally to the fifty-sixth Session of the Commission in July 2023.

In 2020, at its fifty-third session, the Commission considered a proposal by Armenia, the Russian Federation and Viet Nam to update the UNCITRAL agenda in the light of the novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19) (A/CN.9/1039/Rev.1). This proposal suggested that the Commission might wish to investigate whether those measures had exposed gaps or obstacles to cross-border trade and investment that could be overcome through efforts put in place by UNCITRAL in harmonising cross-border rules. After discussion, the Commission requested the Secretariat to explore this proposal further (A/75/17, part two, para.89).

In 2021, at its fifty-fourth session, the Commission expressed its appreciation to States that shared best practices and experiences through their responses to the questionnaire circulated by the secretariat. In 2022, at its fifty-fifth session, it was noted by the Commission that there was still a residual constraint and impact of the pandemic upon international trade law, thus seeing a further need for UNCITRAL instruments in aiding States in developing effective policy and legislative responses to unforeseen global crises, in an effort to minimise the harmful disruptions to trade, business and investment, as well as in the recovery efforts thereafter.

After discussion, the Commission requested the secretariat continue its exploratory work on the impact of COVID-19 on international trade by holding expert group meetings and

other events with interested stakeholders to further advance such work. It was said that the exploratory work should ultimately result in an emergency kit that could be useful at the outset of any crisis and that would provide information to States, as well as businesses, especially MSMEs, on the effective use of UNCITRAL instruments in case of a crisis.

The UNCITRAL secretariat has organised meetings worldwide while discharging its exploratory work mandate. In particular, in February 2023, the UNCITRAL secretariat collaborated with Viet Nam in the first in-person meeting of the APEC Economic Committee in organising a Policy Dialogue entitled "Impact of International Health Crisis on Legal Infrastructure for Trade and Implications for Structural Reform". This Policy Dialogue contributed to set the scene for the development of the draft emergency tool kit for economies and public and private stakeholders in the event of a future health crisis that could similarly impact supply chains and trade flows.
