#### Notes on the provisional agenda

Pursuant to a decision taken by the Commission at its twenty-first session, 1/ the Working Group on International Contract Practices devoted its twelfth session to a review of the draft Uniform Rules on Guarantees being prepared by the International Chamber of Commerce and to an examination of the desirability and feasibility of any future work relating to greater uniformity at the statutory law level in respect of guarantees and stand-by letters of credit. The Working Group recommended that work be initiated on the preparation of a uniform law, whether in the form of a model law or in the form of a convention.

The Commission, at its twenty-second session, accepted the recommendation of the Working Group that work on a uniform law should be undertaken and

entrusted this task to the Working Group. The secretariat was requested to prepare the necessary documentation. 2/

The Working Group is composed of all States members of the Commission. These are:

Algeria, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Brazil, Central African Republic, Chile, China, Cuba, Cyprus, Czechoslovakia, Egypt, France, German Democratic Republic, Hungary, India, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Lesotho, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mexico, Netherlands, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Spain, Sweden, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United Republic of Tanzania, United States of America, Uruguay, and Yugoslavia.

Item 1. Election of officers

The Working Group, in accordance with its practice at previous sessions, may wish to elect a Chairman and a Rapporteur.

Item 3. Possible issues of a uniform law on guarantees and stand-by letters of credit

The Working Group will have before it at the thirteenth session a note by the Secretariat (A/CN.9/WG.II/WP.65) containing a discussion of certain issues possibly to be dealt with in a uniform law on guarantees and stand-by letters of credit. The Working Group may wish to use the note as a basis for its deliberations.

The following documents will be made available at the session:

- (a) Report of the Working Group on International Contract Practices on the work of its twelfth session (A/CN.9/316);
- (b) Note by the Secretariat setting forth tentative considerations on the preparation of a uniform law (A/CN.9/WG.II/WP.63);
- (c) Report of the Secretary-General on stand-by letters of credit and guarantees (A/CN.9/301).

Item 5. Adoption of the report

The Working Group may wish to adopt, at the close of its session, a report for submission to the twenty-third session of the Commission.

Meetings

The session of the Working Group will take place at United Nations Headquarters, New York. Meetings are scheduled from 8 to 12 January and from 15 to 19 January. No meeting will be scheduled for Thursday, 18 January in order to allow for the preparation of the draft report of the session. Meeting hours will be from 10 am to 1 pm and 3 pm to 6 pm, except on Monday, 8 January 1990, when the session will commence at 10.30 am.
