#### Notes on the provisional agenda

The Working Group on the New International Economic Order was established at the eleventh session of the Commission. 1/ Its membership was decided at the twelfth session of the Commission. 2/ At the thirteenth session of the Commission, the membership was increased to include all other States members of the Commission. 3/ The Working Group consists, therefore, of the following States:

Algeria, Australia, Austria, Brazil, Central African Republic, China, Cuba, Cyprus, Czechoslovakia, Egypt, France, German Democratic Republic, Germany, Federal Republic of, Guatemala, Hungary, India, Iraq, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Mexico, Nigeria, Peru, Philippines, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Spain, Sweden, Trinidad and Tobago, Uganda, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United Republic of Tanzania, United States of America and Yugoslavia.

The Working Group at its first session, held in New York in January 1980, recommended to the Commission for possible inclusion in its work programme, inter alia, the harmonization, unification and review of contractual provisions commonly occurring in international contracts in the field of industrial development. 4/ The Commission, at its thirteenth session, agreed to accord priority to work related to contracts for the supply and construction of large industrial works and requested the Secretary-General to carry out a study concerning clauses used in these contracts. The study was prepared by the Secretariat in two parts 5/, and was examined by the Working Group at its second and third sessions. 6/

At its second session, the Working Group decided to request the Secretariat to commence the preparation of a legal guide on contracts for the supply and construction of large industrial works. 7/ The Commission, at its fourteenth session, approved the decision by the Working Group and decided that the guide should identify the legal issues involved in such contracts and suggest possible solutions to assist parties, in particular from developing countries, in their negotiations. 8/ The Working Group at its third session requested the Secretariat to submit to the Working Group an outline of the structure of the guide and some sample draft chapters. 9/ At its fourth session the Working Group discussed the outline of the structure of the legal guide and draft chapters on "Choice of contract type", "Exemptions" and "Hardship clauses". 10/

At its fifth session the Working Group discussed draft chapters on "Termination" 11/, "Inspection and tests", "Failure to perform" 12/, "Variation clauses", "Assignment" and "Suspension of construction" as well as a note on the format of the guide. 13/ Some general observations were exchanged on the draft chapter on "Damages" 14/ and consideration of this draft chapter and the draft chapter on "Liquidated damages and penalty clauses" 15/ was postponed to the sixth session.

## Item 3. Consideration of draft chapters of the legal guide on drawing up international contracts for construction of industrial works

The Working Group will have before it draft chapters of the guide on "Scope and quality of works", "Completion, acceptance and take-over", "Allocation of risk of loss or damage", "Insurance", "Sub-contracting" and "Security for performance" (A/CN.9/WG.V/WP.13 and Add. 1-6). Also made available at the session will be the draft chapter on "Damages" (A/CN.9/WG.V/WP.11/Add.4) and the draft chapter on "Liquidated damages and penalty clauses" (A/CN.9/WG.V/WP.11/Add.5).

#### Item 5. Adoption of the report

A progress report on the sixth session of the Working Group is to be submitted to the Commission.
