### GUO Yu Associate professor and the director of the Maritime Law Research Centre of Beijing University

GUO Yu is an associate professor and the director of the Maritime Law Research Centre of Beijing University. She obtained her master's degree from the Shanghai Maritime University, PhD from the Beijing University and LLM from the University of Cambridge. She joined the faculty at the Law School of Beijing University, where she is teaching since 1996.

Her main research interests are maritime law, international commercial law and e-commerce law. Among the several works of Guo Yu are: A Study on the Bill of Lading (1997), The Law of International Sale of Goods (1999), The Spirit of Maritime Law: Theory and Practice in China (2006), Legal Protection of Personal Data (2012), and Legislation on Electronic Transferable Record: Problem and Solution (2019).

Guo Yu participated as a member of the Chinese delegation in the negotiation of the UNCITRAL Model Law on Electronic Transferable Records, UNCITRAL Model Law on Warehouse Receipts and the United Nations Convention on Negotiable Cargo Documents.







Marina Comninos Co-Head, ICE Digital Trade (formerly essDOCS)



Marina joined essDOCS on a part-time basis in 2006 as General Counsel and took a full-time role as Head of Solution Delivery in 2013. Later in the same year, Marina was appointed Chief Operating Officer, and in 2018, was named Co-CEO & Chief Operating Officer. Today, Marina serves as Co-Head of ICE Digital Trade – a role she has held since the acquisition of essDOCS by Intercontinental Exchange Inc. in 2022 – taking on joint leadership duties with Co-Head, Alexander Goulandris.
