





- EU funded project for enhancing traceability and transparency of sustainable value chains in garment and footwear, jointly with ITC, ILO (2019-2024)


Capacity building and advisory services

Key trends from UN Global Survey on Digital and Sustainable Trade Facilitation, 2023







- Globally, the implementation rate of trade facilitation improved from 63% in 2021 to 69% in 2023.
- In the UNECE region, average implementation rate of trade facilitation improved from 76% in 2021 to 80% in 2023.
- In the SPECA region, average implementation rate of trade facilitation improved from 63% in 2021 to 66% in 2023.





Transfer of MLETR-Compliant Titles

- UN/CEFACT Project led by Mr. Ren Yuh Kay (Singapore), under the Supply Chain Management Domain
- Aimed at developing the framework and guidance (White Paper) on how to achieve the requirements outlined in the MLETR for electronic transferable records, while considering issues of reliability
- This guidance material looks at:
 - How Distributed Ledger Technology could be used to facilitate title transfers of MLETR-compliant title records (other feasible technologies may also be considered)
 - How existing UN/CEFACT deliverables could be used in this context
 - Key issues to consider while creating, administering and using technologies for electronic transferable records
