




- Conducted jointly by all five UN **Regional Commissions** and UNCTAD, in collaboration with global and (sub)regional partners
- **WTO TFA+** 58 trade facilitation measures (2015-2021)
- **144+ economies** globally, 46 from Asia-Pacific region



Implementation varies widely across countries and subregions






Implementation accelerated in all subregions




Trade facilitation implementation by subregions in Asia and the Pacific, 2019 and 2021



Implementation of cross-border paperless trade is still a challenge despite most progress made




Implementation of different groups of trade facilitation measures in Asia-Pacific, 2019 and 2021



Implementation of cross-border paperless trade measures remains low




State of implementation of Cross-Border Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific

Supporting Digital TF: Framework Agreement on the Facilitation of Cross-Border Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific (CPTA)



- A UN Treaty: enabling and action-oriented
 - ✓ Open to interested (53) ESCAP member states (voluntary) to become parties
- Objective
 - ✓ To <u>facilitate</u> cross-border paperless trade (data exchange) among willing ESCAP member states by providing a <u>dedicated multilateral platform to</u> develop legal and technical solutions for cros-border e-exchange of trade-data
 - ✓ Complementary to the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA) as well as (sub)regional efforts (FTAs and DEAs)



8 parties accounting for 40% of Asia-Pacific trade

3 new countries acceded in 2022:

- Timor Leste
- Turkmenistan
- Mongolia



Top 5 recommendations – technical and legal



Establish or strengthen the stakeholder coordination mechanism

Enhance awareness and conduct capacity building of on cross border paperless trade

Establish / enhance / implement strategic plan and guidelines on business continuity of ICT systems, incl. a disaster recovery

Conduct data harmonization for the implementation and upgrading of the ICT system [on the basis of international standards]

Conduct Business Process Re-engineering on the implementation and upgrading of ICT system relevant to trade related regulatory agencies


Modernize, simplify, streamline laws and regulations governing electronic transctions

Adopt / amend the law on use of data / data governance / data flows, incl. protection of privacy and confidentiality

Conduct awareness / capacity-building on legal issues related to paperless trade

Establish / improve legal basis for paperless trade environment / operation of the NSW

Initiate /participate in multilateral and bilateral cross-border paperless trade interoperability initiatives (including joining the CBPTA)
